HSBC WARNS AGAINST PHISHING EMAIL

The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Limited would like to alert its customers to phishing emails purported to be from HSBC. The phishing emails suggest the recipients to click on a link and cancel a transaction that they are not responsible for.

HSBC would like to remind its customers that it has no connection with the phishing emails involved. Customers are advised not to open any link in the email. The public should also safe-keep their login credentials. HSBC reiterated that it will not send SMS or email messages with embedded hyperlinks directing customers to its websites or mobile applications to carry out transactions, or request for sensitive personal information or credit card details from customers through hyperlinks.
