# HSBC WARNS AGAINST PHISHING EMAIL AND FRAUDULENT WEBSITE

The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Limited would like to alert its customers to a phishing email purported to be sent by HSBC and a fraudulent website.

The phishing email suggests recipients to click a link to a fraudulent website: http://markkorea.kr/data/wall/key.html

The website suggests that customers should provide their credit card information to receive relief assistance.

HSBC would like to remind its customers that it has no connection with the phishing email and fraudulent website involved. Customers are advised not to click any link in the email or provide the website with any personal information.




