
HSBC WARNS AGAINST PHISHING EMAIL AND FRAUDULENT WEBSITES

The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Limited would like to alert its customers to a phishing email and two fraudulent websites purported to be from HSBC. The phishing email suggests that recipients should participate in a survey to receive a gift.

HSBC would like to remind its customers that it has no connection with the phishing email and fraudulents websites involved. Customers are advised not to open any link in the email.

Customers should also safe-keep their login credentials for internet banking. HSBC reiterate that it will not send SMS or email messages with embedded hyperlinks directing customers to its websites or mobile applications to carry out transactions, or request for sensitive personal information from customers through hyperlinks.
